Qualifications:

- Currently enrolled in and returning to full-time secondary or post-secondary studies. A background (Major or Minor) in Museum Studies, History, Anthropology, Library Science, Archeology, Sociology, Indigenous Studies, or Tourism/Business is encouraged but not required.
- Legally entitled to work in Canada (Canadian Citizen, permanent resident or refugee status in Canada) between 15 and 30 years old as per the Canada Summer Jobs and Young Canada Works guidelines (<u>https://www.canada.ca/en/canadian-heritage/services/funding/young-canada-works/students-graduates/heritageorganizations-students.html</u>).
